




Snakebite Treatment Training Course

This practical snakebite treatment training course, offered by **SAICRIO** in conjunction with **Snake Safety Zambia**, is designed for health professionals who may encounter snakebite cases in their work. Led by **Marcel van Driel**, the course equips participants with the knowledge and practical skills to identify snakebite syndromes, provide appropriate first aid, assess and monitor patients, and deliver safe, evidence-based clinical management, including antivenom use where indicated.

Who should attend	Doctors, clinical officers, clinical licentiates, nurses, surgeons, community health workers and medical students.

Certification	Certificates are shared after the training upon successful completion of the course and short-course assessment.
Course fee	K2,200 per participant for individual enrolment. Payment confirms registration. The fee should be sent to MTN MoMo account number with 0962000246 under the account name COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH INSTITUTE ORGANISATION
Training Process	Registration is confirmed upon payment. Participants then attend the 2-day training in Lusaka from 08:30 to 16:30 on the first day and 08:30 to 12:30 on the second day. A short assessment is conducted at the end of the course, and certificates are issued after successful completion.
Group bookings	Pricing for group or institutional training depends on factors

such as location, number of participants, and training requirements. A tailored package can be agreed based on your needs. The training is offered in cycles of 60 days.
